2. **Pre-registration is required for All Exhibitors, All Designs, All Botanical, All Educational Exhibits – call ENTRY CHAIRMAN Judy Paul at 530-200-5013 for your Exhibitor Number #, required prior to show before March 31, 2025, by 5pm. Entry tags will be available before the Show either from Judy Paul, Carolyn Hoyum, or from individual clubs in the Cascade District, and at the show.**
3. Flower show conforms to the standards established by National Garden Clubs, Inc (NGC). The Handbook for Flower Shows (HB), 2017 Edition, with revisions printed in The National Gardener Magazine (TNG) is the authority for all issues not covered by the schedule, which is the law of the show
4. April 1, 2025 at Neighborhood Church 4684 Rhonda Rd, Anderson, Ca., Doors open for set up at 8:00am. From 8:30-9:45am entries accepted. Judging will begin at 10:00am. Exhibits may be removed after 2:00pm on Tuesday. Public may view at noon or when judging is complete
5. The Classification Chairmen for each division checks exhibits for conformity to the schedule prior to judging. Final determination for conformance is the judges' responsibility.
6. The General Chairman and the Classification Chairmen for each division are available during judging for possible consultation. They, along with the judges and clerks, are the only personnel allowed on the floor during judging.
7. The decisions of the judges are final; awards may be withheld if not merited.
8. There must be an emphasis on FRESH plant material. NO artificial plant material is permitted in any exhibit in any division.
9. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry per class, except in the Horticulture Division.
10. The Show Sponsors will strive to assure the safety of all items after arrival and placement but are not responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits.
11. California's policy on native plants, invasive and noxious plants and those on its conservation list is listed on the California Department of Fish & Wildlife website which is wildlife.ca.gov

HORTICULTURE RULES Horticulture General Rules listed in the NGC Revised 2022 HB for Flower Shows page 27 – 28. Can be down loaded from National Garden Clubs. Org FS handbook.

1. More than one entry may be entered per class provided it is a different cultivar, type, or color.
2. To be eligible for a Top Exhibitor Award, all horticulture specimens must be correctly named according to its binomial name or currently accepted scientific designation.
3. All plant material must be grown by exhibitor according to NGC Revised 2022 HB p55.
4. Containers will be furnished for horticulture cut specimens.
5. There should be no foliage below water line, except gladiolus.
6. Plant material may not be altered by “shines” or oils.
7. Wedging acceptable if unobtrusive, provided by Cascade District.
8. Container plants measured inside lip to lip.
9. Specimens with designated class can’t enter in “any other class”.
10. Classes may be sub-divided if deemed necessary.

Class 2 Collage, “Festive” – maximum size 30”x 30” An abstract design created on a background panel with a dominance of components attached in a non-realistic arrangement. Components include plant material and other found objects. Easels will be provided by show.

Class 3 Exploration-Freedom of Style, “Fleur De Lis Fantasy” – maximum 30” x 30” x no height limit Freedom to explore the world of creativity with plant material and design. Some plant material must be used but there is no restriction on what can be done to the plant material. (Note: This is the only class permitting treatment of fresh plant material such as painting, flocking, or dyeing.)

2. Youth age divisions will be stated as follows:
Juniors- preschool through age seven(7)
Intermediates- age eight(8) through twelve(12)
High School- age thirteen(13) through eighteen(18)
3. All NGC policies and rules apply. The NGC Exhibit Policies are printed in the NCG Handbook for Flower Shows Chapter 9, Exhibiting in the Youth and Sponsored Groups Division, NGC policies and guidelines.
4. All design exhibits must be created solely by the exhibitor.
5. All horticulture exhibits must be grown by the exhibitor, though plants can be part of a family garden.
6. Container-grown plants must have been in possession of the youth exhibitor for a minimum of sixty (60) days.
7. Combination planting must have been grown together for at least three(3) weeks.
8. Photos of flower show event including youth participants may be used in publications and social media. We will require a permission slip from parents authorizing the club to use photos with youth for club activities.
9. All plant material needs to be written down on a 3"x5".
